Dainty Bess is a beauti- loved of the single Hybrid Teas and is available from nurseries around the world. The blooms can be a single flower but are generally in clusters of up to seven or more on one cane. The stamens are maroon and the petals are silky pink.

The fragrance is moderate tea and the foliage is leathery, dark green. The growth is vigorous and the height of the plant makes is good for a mixed border. It has an ARS rating of 8.4. In 1935 a climbing Dainty Bess was introduced. Both are repeat bloomers which bloom prolifically at the start of the season and intermittently thereafter. If you like single petaled roses you will love *Dainty Bess*.

January Consulting Rosarian Report By Mary Maud Sharpe

It is time to get serious about plans for the spring bloom. If you have roses you need to move to a different location it is time to prepare the places that you plan to plant. Have a soil test done on your present beds and perhaps the new location too. Reworking older beds is one of the must do tasks at this time of the year. Your soil test report will help you in knowing what additives you will need. Loosen the soil in your beds so that it is not compact and will drain well. Remove winter weeds and cut out dead wood. (Dead wood can be removed at any time of the year.) Place orders for new varieties that you would like to have. Popular varieties sell out quickly. Remember that fortuniana rootstock does well in our area, so purchase plants on this rootstock if you can find them. The promise of spring and the roses it brings each year is what our rose growing hobby is all about. Enjoy and share your roses in 2015!

There will be soil test kits available at this meeting, if you did not get one at the December social. It does include all the information you need to take your sample and send it for analysis.

ARS Consulting Rosarians

(What They Do and How to Become One)

The ARS Consulting Rosarian Program is probably the most important thing for a local society. These ARS/Local Society Members are the experienced rosarians that help and mentor new rosarians. They have been certified by ARS after attending a CR school and passing a test. Their service is to anyone not just society members and it is at no charge. They will consult with you at any time and even make "house calls" by coming to your garden to look at your particular situations and tell you what they would continue or change to grow better roses. If they do not know the answers immediately they will research and find out the best plans of action and get back to you. Their knowledge is quite extensive and their experiences in their own gardens will is a starting point to assist you. Many of their suggestions will also be cost saving ideas and most of us have all ready learned that growing roses can be costly (but well worth the price). They may also be able to give you time saving ideas for the things you need to do to keep your roses healthy and producing the beautiful blooms that all of us want our plants to produce.

ARS has developed a Consulting Rosarian Manual that has recently been updated and is available on the ARS web site for reference or to download and print. It is free and available. CR's use it and you can too.

The chapters include all the thing you need to know:

- Consulting Rosarian
- Consulting Rosarian Program
- Consulting Rosarian Mission
- Basic Rose Culture
- Soil & Water
- Fertilizers
- Pest Control
- Pesticides and Safety
- Major Insect Pests
- Diseases

Qualifications to become a CR are:

- Must be a regular or associate of ARS for three consecutive years.
- Must be active member of a local society.
- Must have grown rose for at least five years.
- Must send a CR candidate form and three letters of recommendation to DSD CR chairman.
- Must attend an ARS school and pass the open book test.
- Must attend all programs at a school.
- Must know and live up to CR code
- Must attend one CR School or seminar at least every four years.
- Must willingly share knowledge and enthusiasm for roses.
- Filing a Roses in Review form is expected annually.
- Complete an activity form each year.

Cindy Dale, South Metro Rose Society, Peachtree City, Georgia is the current national chairman of Consulting Rosarians. Ralph Stream, Gainesville Rose Society, Micanopy, Florida is the current Deep South District chairman of Consulting Rosarians and Pat Stanford is the TARS Coordinator of Consulting Rosarians. The society CR's are listed on page 4.

CR's are very important to a local society. They share their knowledge, experience and love of roses. The world of roses can be intimidating to many gardeners and CR's can make growing rose an enjoyable, fun experience simply by their guidance. It is our hope that you as a member of TARS will seriously consider attending the proposed school and becoming a CR. You may choose to audit this year and become a CR at a later date and we encourage you to also consider this if you do not meet the qualification. The information presented at the school will help you grow better roses and make your rose growing hobby one that you will enjoy even more.
