was and did not think it was one of the Goodwood roses. Then I called Heide Clifton and asked her if it would be possible for me to drop by. As soon as I got out of my vehicle, Heide met me at her gate and said that it was *Belinda's Dream*. We had a nice visit and she shared with me some history of *Belinda's Dream* and gave me some helpful rose tips.

Dr. Robert Bayuse developed this rose while searching for a very disease resistant and thornless specimen. He was dissatisfied with it because of the thorns, but agreed to let it be introduced and gave it the name of the young daughter of some close friends. This rose was introduced in 1988. The rose, *Belinda's Dream* is a cross between "Tiffany" and "Jersey Beauty".

Belinda's Dream has characteristics of a hybrid tea, high centered with long stems. The foliage is beautiful; it is fragrant and has double pink blossoms. Belinda's Dream starts blooming in mid-spring and repeats reliably throughout the growing season. The rose grows three to six feet and is three to four feet wide.

So now I can say that my favorite rose is *Belinda's Dream*. I have three of these beauties in my yard.

Also to help plants become dormant discontinue use of any nitrogen fertilizer. With the drought conditions continue to water. Hopefully the hurricane season is over, but stake or restake any bushes that are very tall so that winter winds do not topple them.

As the rose growing season winds down, My wishes for you are happy holidays and a great year of roses in 2012.
