Program:

Presentation by Janet on "Black Spot in Roses" per an ARS webinar by David Zlesak of the University of Wisconsin, River Falls, had a lot of information on the Diplocarpon Rosae infection which has 13 – 14 different races (types) of blackspot that can show up on roses. Research is being done to determine how to develop more resistant roses.

There was then a discussion by members on the future of TARS and a vote was taken after Gerard made a motion that we vote by a show of hands to continue as an official Rose Society and Mary Lou seconded the motion. All 9 members were in favor of the motion; none opposed. One point of the discussion was that we should all aim to bring a friend to meetings.

The storage unit has been emptied.

The door prize was won by Leanna Willison.

The October 2nd meeting will have a presentation by Renee titled "A Rose by Any Other Name" and refreshments will be provided by Mary Lou.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:07 P.M.

OCTOBER ROSE CARE

New rose growth is much more susceptible to frost damage, so it's best to stop feeding your roses about 6 weeks before the first frost to help them slow their growth. Here in the Tallahassee area, the first frost generally happens between late October and the middle of November. For the same reason, any pruning that you do this time of year should be minimal, just getting rid of damaged, dead, or diseased stems. You might want to

discontinue deadheading your roses, especially if you enjoy seeing pretty rose hips. If you decide not to deadhead your roses, I recommend removing the petals from the spent blooms in order to minimize inviting botrytis. Continue to watch for, and deal with, insect damage and diseases.

Do enjoy your rose plants throughout the season. You may be surprised by the number of rose blossoms that you see in fall and even in winter, as they continue to reward you for the good care that you gave them during the active growing season. Your rest from fertilizing your roses should continue till they start really growing again, in late February or in March.

This is a good time to begin to be thinking about next year's rose garden. What changes do you want to make? Do you want to "shovel prune" any under-performing plants, and/or add any new ones? We will be talking about new opportunities to enrich your garden and sources of new plants at TARS meetings throughout the year.
